HISTORIC TANGIER

Experience Tangier's natural beauty and outdoor activities by visiting **Cap Spartel**, where the Atlantic Ocean meets the Mediterranean Sea, and enjoy a breathtaking sunset. Explore the mythologically significant **Caves of Hercules**, featuring a sea view shaped like Africa. Relax, swim, or enjoy water sports on the sandy shores of **Tangier Beach**. Stroll through **Rmilat Park** for scenic views of the city and sea.

Delight in Tangier's cuisine and local delicacies by savoring traditional Moroccan dishes like **tagine**, **couscous**, and **pastilla** at local restaurants.
